**Manuscript Requirements**

Please prepare your manuscript before submission, using the following guidelines:

<b>Format</b>	MS Word document (A4 size), single spaced, 1 inch margin from each side, pages should be numbered consecutively.
<b>Article Language</b>	English
<b>Article Length</b>	Articles should be between 3000 to 15000 words in length (6 - 20 pages) including text, references, and appendices.
<b>Title Page Content</b>	An Article Title Page should be having following contents: <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Article Title</li><li>• Author Details</li><li>• Abstract</li><li>• Keywords (maximum up to 5 key words)</li></ul>
<b>Author Details</b>	Details should be supplied on the Article Title Page including: <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Full name of each author</li><li>• Affiliation of each author, at time research was completed</li><li>• Where more than one author has contributed to the article, details of who should be contacted for correspondence</li><li>• E-mail address of the corresponding author</li></ul>
<b>Abstract</b>	Author(s) must supply abstract (maximum 300 words)on the Article Title Page which should include the purpose, design/methodology/approach, and findings of the study.
<b>Headings</b>	Headings must be concise, with a clear indication of the distinction between the hierarchies of headings.
<b>Notes/Endnotes</b>	Notes or Endnotes should be used only if absolutely necessary and must be identified in the text by consecutive numbers, enclosed in square brackets and listed at the end of the article.
<b>Figures</b>	All Figures (charts, diagrams, line drawings, web pages/screenshots, and photographic images) should be submitted in electronic form.  All Figures should be of high quality, legible and numbered consecutively with Arabic numerals. Photographic images should be submitted electronically and of high quality. They should be saved as .tif or .jpeg files at a resolution of at least 300dpi and at least 10cm wide.
<b>Tables</b>	Tables should be typed and included in the main body of the article. The position of each table should be clearly labeled in the body text of article.
<b>References</b>	References to other publications must be in APA style (examples mentioned below are with some modifications in APA style) and carefully checked for

	completeness, accuracy and consistency. You should cite publications in the text: (Miller, 2009) using the first named author's name or (Mutula and Wamukoya, 2007) citing both names of two, and (Smith <i>et al.</i> , 2007), when there are three or more authors. At the end of the paper a reference list in alphabetical order should be supplied.
<i>For books</i>	Surname, Initials. (Year). <i>Title of Book</i> . Place: Publisher.  e.g. Miller, M. (2009). <i>Cloud computing: web based applications that change the way you work and collaborate online</i> . Noida: Pearson Education.
<i>For book chapters</i>	Surname, Initials. (Year). Chapter title. In Editor's Surname, Initials, <i>Title of Book</i> (pages). Place of publication: Publisher.  e.g. Singh, A. (2010). Digital divide for rural world: a review of government initiatives. In Parashar, V. (Ed.), <i>Current Trends of ICT in Rural World</i> (pp. 71-79). Jaipur: Research & Innovations Publishing.
<i>For journals</i>	Surname, Initials. (Year). Title of article. <i>Journal Name</i> . Volume(number), pages.  e.g. Singh, L. Lolit Kumar. (2012). A review on broadband microstrip antennas. <i>International Journal in Electronics and Communication Technology</i> . 3(3), 192-197.
<i>For published conference proceedings</i>	Surname, Initials. (Year). Title of paper. In Surname, Initials (Ed.), <i>Title of published proceeding with theme of conference</i> (pages). Place: Publisher.  e.g. Shukla, A. & Verma, M. K. (2014). Digital divide and agricultural knowledge society. In Pandey. M. <i>et al.</i> (Eds.) <i>Proceedings of National Conference of Agricultural Librarians and User Community (NCALUC - 2014) on "Agricultural Information Management in Digital Era"</i> (pp.171-173). Raipur: Nehru Library, Indira Gandhi Krishi Vishwavidyalaya.
<i>For encyclopedia entries (with no author or editor)</i>	<i>Title of Encyclopedia</i> . (Year). Title of article. Volume, edition. Place of publication: Publisher. (pages).  e.g. <i>Encyclopaedia Britannica</i> . (1926). Psychology of culture contact. Vol. 1, 13 <sup>th</sup> ed. New York: London and New York. pp. 765-771.
<i>For newspaper articles (authored)</i>	Surname, Initials. (Year). Article title. <i>Newspaper</i> , date, pages.  e.g. Smith, A. (2008). Money for old rope. <i>Daily News</i> , 21 January, pp. 1, 3-14.
<i>For newspaper articles (non-authored)</i>	<i>Newspaper</i> . (Year). Article title. Date, pages.  e.g. <i>Daily News</i> . (2008). Small change. 2 February, p. 7.
<i>For electronic</i>	If available online, the full URL should be supplied at the end of the reference,

<i>sources</i>	as well as a date that the resource was accessed.  e.g. Thelwall, M. (2001). A publicly accessible database of UK university website links and a discussion of the need for human intervention in web crawling.
